

Peace in the Storm

"The men were amazed and asked, 'What kind of man is this? Even the winds and the waves obey him!"

- Matthew 8:27 (NIV)

SHRIIIEEEEEEEEK!

The fire alarm startled me awake at 3 a.m. I climbed down from the top bunk, threw on some clothes, and left my dorm room. Walking towards the stairwell, I noticed a little smoke coming from the kitchen. At that moment, the unmistakable stench hit my nose. I knew then and there what caused the fire alarm to go off: burnt popcorn.

I think Jesus had a similar experience on one fateful boat ride. He and his disciples loaded up in a boat after an intense day of preaching, so who could fault Jesus for taking a nap? A storm came up over the waters, and the wind intensified. When the waves threatened to capsize the boat, the disciples must have been shocked that Jesus continued to sleep.

So Jesus' disciples woke him, probably with a startle and a shriek. But Jesus didn't seem too worried about the situation. To Him, it was nothing more than burnt popcorn. He told the storm, "Quiet! Be still!"(Mark 4:39 NIV). And the storm listened! That probably shocked His followers even more. Afterwards, Jesus turned to his disciples and asked, "Where is your faith?

God knows how poorly we operate under fear. In fact, one of Jesus' most common commands in the Bible is to "fear not." While Jesus knew they would make it across the lake, His disciples weren't let in on that part of the plan. And while Jesus challenged them about their faith, He also increased it by calming the storm.

Next time you're facing a storm, don't tell God how big it is. Instead, tell the storm how big your God is. Think About It...

What does this devotional reveal to me about God?
What does this devotional reveal to me about myself?
Based on this, what changes do I need to make?
What is my prayer for today?
